Who Actually Speaks Finnish?

"Finnish is the language of the majority [of the Finnish population] and is spoken by nearly 5 million people as their first language; it is the second language for [an] additional half a million people. Hundreds of thousands of Finnish-speaking people live in other countries outside of Finland. The Finnish language is studied in more than 100 universities around the world." —From "Being receptive to the Finnish language," by Lea Laitinen and Pirkko Nuolijärvi; trans. Leena Vänni. So Suomi

Verner E. Suomi, a meteorologist who developed weather-forecasting technology that makes it easier to plan space missions, agricultural irrigation and family picnics, died in August 1995 at the age of 79. Dr. Suomi, a professor of atmospheric science, was internationally recognized as a developer of imaging technologies that made modern weather satellites possible, including the spin-scan camera that transmits images back to earth from 25,000 miles above the equator and has revolutionized weather forecasting and atmospheric studies. Dr. Suomi, a native of Eveleth, Minn., with a doctorate in meteorology from the University of Chicago, used to say that his Finnish ancestors pronounced the name "Sue-WOE-me" but that "SUE-me" was close enough.

members deceased since the April membership meeting: Jim Aro, Don Jacobson, Laura Mazur and Lori Vinette. Of 180 members, all but 55 have elected to save themselves the \$15 annual cost of receiving mailed newsletters and get theirs in color online. The Association's finances were "much better" than a year earlier, although they were somewhat down through August, according to Dick Pype in his treasurer's report. The increase in membership assessments from \$220 to \$250 per year has given us a small cushion. The largest financial item was approval to spend up to \$15,000 on a used dump truck (below), which in fact cost less than the allocation when it was purchased recently.



Blast from the Past: Loon Lake Bowling Leagues

There were three Finn Camp bowling leagues in the past, which were named Loon Lake Bowling. The ladies bowled at several different bowling alleys, with first four and then six teams. The men bowled at several different alleys, mostly at Fleetwood Lanes. Eero Toivonen and Lee Siren were the last Finn Camp bowlers in the Loon Lake Bowling League before it dissolved. The third league was the Loon Lake Husband and Wife Bowling League, which bowled at various alleys, starting at Tony's Bowling Alley and Bar. The photo of the men's league was taken at the Lucky Strike Lanes. "Mr. Hockey," Gordie Howe, came to watch us amateurs bowl one night at Lucky Strike. He was an unmarried rookie at the time and didn't yet have a circle of friends. The Lucky Strike was near the Olympia Stadium, where the Red Wings played at that time. I bowled in the men's league and Delores bowled in the ladies' league. We both bowled in the Husband and Wife League. My father, Bernhard, along with my brothers Hans and Sven, bowled in the men's league. My mother, Hilda, and sisters-in-law, Lorna and Oneda, all bowled in the ladies' league. Hans and Lorna also bowled in the Husband and Wife League. Later, Erin and Mike bowled in this league. —Harry Kansman
