#### **More Lore: The Finnish Line**

As 2013 came to its finish line, here's how Finland stood, according to Markku Ketola in the December *Finnish American Reporter*.

Of some 136 countries assessed in terms of their citizens' access to health and education as well as their political participation and economic equality, Finland was rated first in both education and health and second in political participation.

One survey ranked Finland as the eighth most prosperous country in the world, which sounds impressive but is down four levels from last year, as a result of decreased gross domestic savings and tech exports and an increase in unemployment.

And in gender equality, Finland rated second, behind Iceland but ahead of Norway and Sweden, who were third and fourth, respectively.

Finally, *Travel & Leisure* reports that Finland, with its 5.4 million people, has more than 3 million saunas. The average age at first sauna is 20 weeks.
