Rescheduled Family Bowling Day



Spring Concert



Jean Sibelius

Music is everywhere in Finland. Most towns have community orchestras and choral societies. International music festivals are hosted in major cities. Hundreds of smaller communities present folk, symphonic, opera, jazz, rock, religious and other types of music.

The nation's greatest and best-known composer is Jean Sibelius, born December 8, 1865, in Hämeenlinna, Finland. Sibelius died in Järvenpää, Finland, on September 20, 1957, at the age of 92. Sibelius composed seven symphonies and a number of shorter works. He became internationally famous at the Paris Exhibition


Sibelius's Symphony no. 2, with its surging melodies and glowing orchestration, is the most popular of his symphonies. It was started in the winter of 1901 in Rapallo, Italy, and given its first performance in final form by Armas Järnefelt on November 10, 1903, in Stockholm.

On Saturday, April 26, you can experience the warmth and joy of Sibelius's Symphony no. 2 at a concert performance by the Saginaw Bay Symphony Orchestra.
