More Lore: Finnances

When the Finn Camp was founded, in 1925, a dollar was worth \$13.37 in 2014 dollars. A Ford Model T runabout cost \$260. That's the equivalent of \$3,475 today. In 1925, membership shares in the new Finn Camp each cost \$120, or \$1,604 in current dollars. The only way many new members could afford to buy their shares was by agreeing to a monthly payment plan of \$5 or \$10. In 2014, Finn Camp membership shares *still* cost \$120. Even given that we have added a nonrefundable fee of \$100 for new memberships—unless the prospective member is a child of a current member—this is still a terrific bargain. Yes, we have had to add an annual assessment to help pay the bills to keep us going. This is currently \$250, or \$125 if you have been a member for 20 consecutive years and are over the age of 65. There is no annual assessment for members over the age of 80 with 20 years of continuous membership. Other benefits of longtime membership are that work hours are no longer required, beginning the year after you turn age 65 with 20 years of continuous membership. (Also, when you reach 75 with 20 continuous years of membership, you qualify for free saunas.) However, there's no reason seniors can't still work hours; many do. Members' children ages 18 to 25 are required to work 16 hours, if they use the facilities, such as camps, beaches and sauna. New rates are now in effect at \$17 per unworked hour.

Member Spotlight: Edwin Elkhill



Many of us Finn Campers know Edwin as a long-time member and for his work with the Tax and Audit committees. But perhaps you didn't know the story about Edwin's last name, which doesn't sound very Finnish. Years ago, Edwin's grandfather and great-uncle were in the tombstone-polishing business in Quincy, Massachusetts. Many of their Irish and Italian customers had a hard time pronouncing their Finnish last name, Hirvimäki. So they changed it to Elkhill, which describes this name in English. In Finnish, hirvi means elk and mäki means hill, or Elkhill. Edwin was born in Highland Park, Mich., in 1933 to John ("Toivo") and Hanna Elkhill. His parents were Finn Camp founding members who built camp 118 in the 1940s. Edwin is said by others to speak fluent Finnish, though he doesn't make this claim for himself.

He graduated from Northwest High School in 1952, following which he attended what was then Lawrence Institute of Technology, at Woodward and Puritan in Highland Park, before being drafted into the army in 1956 and serving in the Yukon Command at Eielson Air Force Base in Alaska. After being discharged, he served in the reserves at Fort Wayne, Mich., and continued his studies at Acme School of Design Engineering in Highland Park. Edwin worked for many years in the automotive industry, for Stellar Engineering in Warren and James Tanuery Associates in Troy. These firms worked closely with Fisher Body, then General Motors in their body shops. Edwin's functions included serving as senior checker, writing engineering summaries, performing cost studies, monitoring tooling operations and reviewing and writing specifications for body shop operations in the assembly plants.

Edwin became a Finn Camp member in 1953 and has served on the Tax Committee since 1979, becoming chairman of that committee in 1996. Edwin is also a member of the Audit Committee, on which he has served since 2000.
