More Lore: Time for a Käsityöläisolut?

Or if you can't pronounce this even before having one, just ask for a craft beer. The growing popularity of these beers has led to the opening of one new craft brewery every week so far this year in Michigan, according to Paul Boissevain of Keweenaw Brewing. In an interview with Vesa Randelin in the August *Finnish American Reporter*, Boissevain said that there are 16 breweries today in the Upper Peninsula, with four now in Copper Country and another set to open soon. New craft beers are almost as prevalent in Finland. Jari Leinonen, the brewmaster of a Finnish microbrewery, reported that "we have a new brewery in Finland almost every month," although "there are many cities without their own breweries."

The IPA style of craft beers is the most popular one in both countries, according to Boissevain. It all depends on what you are looking for, drinking or sipping. As he says, "Our strategy was to make a beer that you can take out fishing and drink 'em on the boat. We make beers for drinking rather than sipping."
