

## Laskiainen

If you like the rush of sledding down a snowy slope, then visit Finland on 'Laskiainen'. This mid-winter 'sliding' festival is celebrated every February. It coincides with Shrove Tuesday or the first day of Lent. Because of the sacredness of Lent, some have assumed this association meant all men had to end their work before participating in the festivities. Legend says that in the 1930's farmers sought youngsters to slide down icy hills in winter to encourage spring crops to grow. The farther the children slid, the taller the crops would grow, or so the farmers believed. After a full day of sledding, the youngsters would be rewarded with steaming bowls of pea soup. The tradition of Laskiainen continues today in Finland as well as in Palo, Minnesota, the home of one of the longest continuously held Finnish-American festivals in the United States. Finnish residents of Palo take Laskiainen seriously. They compare it to a type of Finnish Mardi-Gras.

Valentine's Day, called 'Ystävänpäivä' or Friendship Day, is the second biggest card season of the year. Last February 14th almost 150 extra mail carriers delivered more than three million cards sent to friends throughout the country.

Started in the 1980's, the Finnish Red Cross was among the first to print 'Ystävänpäivä' cards. This more recent annual holiday is now widely commercialized. Both young and old join in bowling, sledding and skating festivities. Groups of friends gather over brunches and dinners and dole out cards, chocolates and even roses. In Finland, there's no reason for anyone to feel left-out on Valentine's Day. 'Ystävänpäivä'.
