Kingdom Of Snow


Finnish castles do exist. Every winter, locals in the town of Kemi, Finland sculpt an elaborate snow castle derived entirely from frozen sea water. The biggest of its kind in Europe, it rests beside the Arctic Ocean on beds of snow. Deemed a present to the world, the first snow castle made its appearance in 1996. Twenty-three years since its inception, constructors now annually change the snow castle's theme. This year's emphasis is on the natural wonders and ecosystems of Finland and Lapland with ice creations based on local animals, ocean life and forests. The massive ice hotel draws visitors from all around the world. Some liken it to a true arctic adventure. Rooms boast lavish ice furnishings, snow floors and powder white walls. A snow chapel on the extensive property performs numerous wedding ceremonies and a restaurant on sight seats two hundred people. During our Canadian travels in 2010, Kai and I toured an ice hotel right outside Quebec City. Though much smaller than the Finnish version, we enjoyed its gorgeous construction and unique atmosphere.
