
Condolences



Finland's Future




Smart technology transformed Helsinki almost two decades ago. In 2001, Jari Mielonen, CTO of Sonera telecommunications, partnered with Finnish entrepreneurs to pilot the world's first wired city. Today, Kalasatma, an experimental district of Helsinki sits by the sea in an old harbor area. A type of wireless wonderland, funded by wealthy investors, the district stands as a model of how a community can function entirely on virtual devices and smart services. Each of its current 3.000 citizens conducts their daily activities through cellphone apps and online media. The Nifty-Neighbor, a social platform, allows citizens to trade services in the hopes of fostering a shared economy. BlindSquare provides visually impaired persons voice prompts to safely walk the city. *Tupp* offers alternatives to owning a vehicle, similar to how a library works; instead of checking out books residents check-out electric cars or taxis from local rental outlets. This reduces on the carbon foot-print and promotes Kalsatma's primary goals: to enhance environmental awareness and optimize the consumption of resources. Best way Kalsatma achieves their goals is through solar panels. Lining all infrastructure they serve as renewable energy while the inclusion of saunas in each building maintains Finnish traditions and relaxes residents too. Even if residents aren't home they can remotely control and monitor their water and electricity usage in real-time. Smart sensors attached to garbage cans demonstrate how to reuse waste. Trash from outside bins is sucked through pipes that travel to processing centers. Soon the Ministry of Transport will award four-hundred euros to every buyer of an electric bicycle. Of course, environmental awareness also comes through education. Schools now devote more time to science, math, personal inquiry and technology. When not in session schools become community centers for citizens to co-create new programs and discuss effectiveness of current services. One idea that derived from such a meeting was a co-operative Senior *Home* where elderly persons cohabit-ate and assist each other with daily routines. By 2030, investors hope they will finish construction of Kalasatma with a projected population of 8,000 and with a high value placed on technology, clean emissions and mass transit. This community, driven completely by smart technology may well pave the future of urban development in other metropolises around the world.


