The Board is requesting that all boats that are stored down at both Sun Lake and Loon Lake be labeled with the owners name and camp number. Please remove any boats that are no longer in use. All boats not labeled by July 1, 2018 will be disposed of properly.

We are happy to announce that Gina O'Neill will be our Beach Manager for the summer season. Gavin Wing Jr. is our new Caretaker.

The Eastern Massasauga (Michigan Rattlesnake) is Michigan's only venomous snake and is a species of special concern and is protected under DNR order and it is unlawful to kill, take, or trap the species. They like to hide under vegetation and woody debris. If you come across a snake, the best advice is to leave it alone. If you get bit by the snake, try to move as little as possible to prevent the venom from spreading. Remove rings watches and bracelets, (do not ice or place a tight-fitting tourniquet around it) and go to the nearest hospital. If you suspect your pet has been bitten, immediately take them to the veterinarian.

As a member with a child or children between the ages of 19 and 25, it is your responsibility to ensure that they work 16 hours or pay guest rates at the beach and sauna. They also are required to pay guest rates if they stay at a camp. See blue book for rates.
