Finnish Artifacts



Dig beneath the buildings in Turku, Finland. You might discover a wealth of artifacts showcasing the wealth of Medieval Turku — a metropolis shored on the southern tip of Finland a few short miles from the Aura River. This once bustling city marked Finland's powerful presence in fourteenth-century Europe. Archeologists began a through excavation of underground Turku last October and recently uncovered well-preserved pharmaceuticals as well as an old street and the cellars and lower levels of two prominent homes. Wedged under the basements of Cathedral School and Aboa Vetus Museum, the homes are thought to have been first owned by Evert Horn, an influential Swedish officer. Later bought by rich merchants, the homes burned in the Great Fire of Turku and now serve as a reminder of those ancient times. ~Naomi Petäinen


Labor Day Golf Tournament.

Finnish taxi services now adhere to a new system. Implemented this past July, lawmakers deregulated the taxi industry in hopes of welcoming more cab companies. Hard to tell what kind of outcome this will have on driver quality but I'd like to think this will benefit the consumer by lowering taxi fares; an important factor to many international and domestic travelers. Especially during the summer months when tourism peaks and each day the Finavia Airport in Helsinki sees over three-hundred taxis per hour. We would like to remind the membership of the TRASH RULES. There is currently a lot of bulky items behind the tractor garage that need to be pulled to the road. This is not the Caretakers job. If you put something back there, it is your responsibility to pull it out to the road on Tuesday evenings to be picked up by the trash service on Wednesday mornings.

As a member with a child or children between the ages of 19 and 25, it is your responsibility to ensure that they work 16 hours or pay guest rates at the beach and sauna. They also are required to pay guest rates if they stay at a camp. See blue book for rates.
