Joann Carol Laitinen Hall, 76, of New York, N.Y., and St. Petersburg, Fla., died on Nov. 10, 2018, at Arden Courts Memory Care Center in Seminole, Fla. Joann graduated from Mackenzie High School in Detroit, attended Wayne University until one semester from graduation, then—on the strength of a great cultural experience in Norway during an American Field Service year—moved to New York City to be on staff at AFS. After 18 years there she then served as Executive Assistant to five national directors of the Girl Scouts of the U.S.A. She was preceded in death by her parents, Finn Campers Uno and Elsie Laitinen, and her sister, Barbara. Survivors include her husband, David R. Hall of St. Petersburg, and her brother-in-law James Ahnemiller and his daughter Janice Finney and his sons Jason Ahnemiller, Craig Ahnemiller, and their families. Joann was an active member of her local United Methodist churches and volunteered all her life in activities involving international families. She was an avid knitter, gardener, book club member, traveler, and caregiver. Joann loved Finn Camp and her "Pikku Tuppa" (tiny cabin) there. Hail to Hockey Night in Finland

Hockey may have sprouted in Canada but Finland prides itself on its own exciting hockey history. Some of the greatest hockey players of all time – Jair Kurri, Juhani Wahlsten and Teemu Selanne to name a few were Finnish born. Scouted by talent agents, these players built their careers on NHL teams, gaining phenomenal success that later won them spots in the Hockey hall of Fame. Their achievements might be why Finlanders hail hockey as their national sport and why they carry such deep regard for its players; players who were the underdogs from the beginning. In 1926 Finland entered the sport under the glaring eyes of Canada, Sweden and Russia whose more established teams ruled the hockey arena. By 1938 Finland competed in the world championships. After many defeats and setbacks the national Finnish hockey league fought their way to the forefront and today ranks among the most renowned leagues in the world. Over thirty Finnish players now dominate hockey including the Finnish women's national hockey team that took home the bronze medal from the 2018 Winter Olympic Games. Finlanders are no strangers to hard work proven by their climb to hockey fame. 
- We will be putting together a cookbook. So, dig out your favorite recipes, Finnish or otherwise. We will update with details in the coming month.
