Pesäpallo Points

Leave it to Finlanders to create their own version of baseball. Pesäpallo, Finland's national sport often played in the countrysides of Finland — may be equated to American baseball, but, with some very different rules. Pesäpallo packs a punch. With a fast pace, constant action, two four-inning periods, no game drags on. No outfield exists. No players strike out from a caught fly ball. Every pitched ball is played. While both teams simultaneously serve as fielders and batters, fielders continuously chase fly-balls as far as neighboring gas stations. Those batters sure can hit. In fact, pitchers pitch, not from a long range mound, but from an arm's length of the batter. They pop that ball vertically, and the batter strikes, then zig-zags to bases. You heard me right, they zig-zag, cause who wants to run in straight lines when zig-zagging to bases is so much cooler. Much what Lauri "Tahko" Pihkala, probably would've said as he thought up Pesäpallo during Babe-Ruth's heyday in the 1920's. He must've shared the same enthusiasm Finlanders still hold for their sport today. Most liken attending Pesäpallo games to attending church. It's that sacred of an event that entire towns, sometimes thousands of fans, show up to cheer on players.

How exciting it is for us at Finncamp as we are planning a Pesäpallo game for this year's Juhannus celebration. Please do consider joining in on this one of a kind opportunity to either play Finland's national sport or cheer on our players. Thanks. See you at the game. ~Naomi Petäinen

Three new boat storage racks will be placed in the area the goats clear. The Twin Willow Ranch that will be supplying the goats. Twin Willow Ranch is a family business run by Denise and Mile Mourer, and has been supplying goats to different organizations in the area to maintain vegetation grown since 2012. The city of Ann Arbor, University of Michigan, and Michigan State University are some of the organizations that have used the goats. The state of California uses goats to control forest fires. The goats will eat invasive plants such as bitter sweet and poison ivy. You are welcome to view the goats at work, but please keep your distance from the electric fence.

Native of Sterling Heights, Michigan... a West-Sider. A committed family man and father of 6 children. Began his career as a stock broker, then quickly demonstrated a keen sense for commodities trading. After success in trading gold and silver, he transitioned his insight to the midwest steel industry. An entrepreneur at heart, and after working for some of the region's largest steel manufacturers as a leading salesperson, he branched off to form his own companies. In 1984, he founded Nordin Industries, a leading steel brokerage firm, and later Bulldog Steel Processing, which handled specialized fabrication of steel products nationally. Ron was a recognized antiquitarian, a lifelong passion he pursued with his wife and best friend, Elayne. They were known in the industry as The Crazy Pair. After developing specialized knowledge of rare timepieces, he enrolled in school and became a certified horologist, capable of assessing value and repairing some of the most delicate and complicated instruments. He was a lover of music which he instilled in all of his children. A profound musician, himself, he played the guitar and harmonica. Playing the Blues was his passion. FinnFest USA 2019, September 19 – 22 Update

FINNFEST USA PROGRAM OUTLINE

Four days, each very different, define the 2019 FinnFest USA program. Created to give Americans a chance to connect to a usually invisible culture in America, FinnFest USA is showcasing what Detroit can reveal about Finland and Finnish America. Using the automobile industry as a touchstone, the festival will re-visit topics like labor relation and artistic creation. The 175th anniversary of the birth of Minna Canth, Finland's pioneer author and feminist, will inspire discussions on contemporary literature and women's rights. Field trips will bring attendees to see Detroit as it has never been seen before in the context of Finnish America.

Thursday, during the day, will feature four options of seminars, classes, and field trips. That evening, FinnFest USA's traditional opening convocation will be a special concert held in a historic movie theatre house followed by a reception where people can meet old friends and begin new friendships to share over the weekend.

On Friday and Saturday, the Sheraton Detroit Novi will house a visible Finnish American community. The tori, the town square for FinnFest USA's 2019 pop-up town, will occupy the ballroom space. Many come just to experience this town square. BUT many discover that this Finnish American world includes music, food, special events and lots of panels and talks occurring throughout the hotel. Four to six panels and talks, held consecutively, will be spread across the day, two sessions in the morning and two in the afternoon, each session 1.5 hours in length. Each day the sessions will be different.

Friday evening and Saturday, Finnish Center and the Finn Camp will expand the town. On Friday, options will include: a concert, a dance, a film. On Saturday, two half day Finnish language immersion opportunities for youth aged 8 to 18 years old will be held at Finn Camp. Saturday evening will again offer concerts and opportunities to dance.

Saturday, Finnish Center will host a Scandinavian buffet, a "tasting menu" of Finnish food specialties, many featured in "Celebrations to Remember," a book written by master chef Soile Anderson and food editor Eleanor Ostman.

Soile will instruct and supervise the caterers to prepare a buffet that proves why Anderson, born in Finland, became the leading Minnesota caterer, feeding kings, presidents (including Obama) and the Dali Lama. Two seatings, September 21, late Saturday afternoon and early evening, will include an opportunity to purchase a copy of Soile's book.

Sunday will feature a worship service in Emmanuel Lutheran church, a mid-20th century modernism church building constructed by the Detroit Finnish American community in the 1950's. Finnish hymns sung in Finnish and English, texts read in Finnish and English, will be led by Dr. Jarmo Tarkki, ELCA & Church of Finland pastor.

The afternoon will offer a family fun day at the Finn Camp, a private open house for FinnFest attendees at Cranbrook, a bus tour of labor-history related site in Detroit, and Finnish folk music workshops and jams. Kardemimmit, a professional kantele ensemble from Finland, will close out the festival with a final concert and Fall equinox kokko in the evening.

A volunteer who:

- Serves on a planning/administration committee receives complimentary registration and discounts on ticketed events; name in program; and an invitation to FinnFest USA reception.
- Works two full days in the two weeks before start of festival receives \$60 off registration fee.
- Works one full day before the festival starts receives a 20% off registration fee.
- Works four hours during and/or after one festival day receives free registration for the rest of that day.
- Ushers at a concert receives a free seat at the concert.
- Works one full, festival day receives a 20% discount on registration fee for the other two festival days.

Attention all committees: The Board would like for you to communicate with us regarding projects and fundraisers you are planning. We would like to support your endeavors and projects and would like to make sure that multiple committees are not planning on tackling the same area to prevent overlapping, or we can connect those committees so they can work together.

Boats that are by the pole barn that are not claimed and removed by July 1, 2019 will be sold or scrapped.

The board would like to remind members that Michigan law prohibits anyone under the age of 21 to consume **alcohol** and to have any amount of **alcohol** in their body. The **law** prohibits the attempt to possess or consume **alcohol** by an **underage** person as well. It is not permitted for anyone under the age of 21 to sell, use, possess, attempt to possess, deliver, or be under any degree of influence (legal intoxication not required) of any alcoholic beverages on DFCSCA grounds.

As a reminder, Smoking is not allowed within 25-feet of any building entrance.

As a member with a child or children between the ages of 19 and 25, it is your responsibility to ensure that they work 16 hours or pay guest rates at the beach and sauna. They also are required to pay guest rates if they stay at a camp. See blue book for rates.

At the sauna building do not park along side of the building adjacent to the outdoor men's changing area as this is a fire lane. In case of an incident an emergency vehicle will need to have access to this area.

Non-members whose stay in a camp exceeds three consecutive days and two consecutive nights in a 30-day period without a member present, or exceeds 10 days and 9 nights in a 30 day period with a member present must pay a rental fee of \$50 a week. Please see the Board Treasurer to sign a contract and provide payment.

Remember that animals must be on leash except in designated areas. See Blue Book rule 203.1.3

No open ground fires permitted.

The second phase of work to re-build the Sun Lake diving tower, a special project which was approved by the membership in the Semi-Annual meeting in October 2017, was completed over the 2018-2019 winter.
