Swim Program

Registration and testing for lessons are tentatively scheduled for Friday, July 5 at Sun Lake. Anyone that cannot make it on the 5th can be registered/assessed for class placement prior to lessons on July 8.

Member Rates - \$50 for 1 child, \$65 for 2 children, \$75 for 3 children. Please inquire if you have 4 or more children interested in lessons.

Non-Member Rates: \$75 for 1 child, \$130 for 2 children, \$180 for 3 children, \$200 for 4 children.

Please note that Non-Member's are responsible to pay for beach/sauna fees should they stay beyond the duration of the swimming lessons and must have a guest to sponsor them.

How this works. Parent will complete and sign the registration form and provide payment (cash or check only). The Instructor will test the child's current swim abilities (this means, please bring their swimsuits) and place them into groups. The Instructor will then establish times for each group that will begin the following Monday. Lessons for each group will be at the same time, Monday through Thursday with Fridays being reserved for a make-up day if earlier lessons were cancelled due to weather. The Instructor will put together various relays and activities for each group to perform at the Swim Meet on August 3. Following the Meet, watermelons are thrown into the lake for the kids to fetch and return to land and ribbons are handed out for their relays.

Note for members and children who are not involved in lessons: Please be reminded that swimming and/or traffic interfering with the lessons shall be avoided. Traffic through the shallow to get to shore should be minimal while the younger kids are having their lessons; and while the older kids are at the platform, the platform on the opposite side of the dock should be used for ingress and egress into/from the lake if not using the ladders at the end of the dock. Parents, please ensure your kiddos are reminded of this consideration. Once lesson times are set, they will be posted on the sauna building.

BOARD NOTES AND REMINDERS

Members with suggestions, comments or board-related business are asked to e-mail board@finncamp.org. General questions may be answered by visiting www.finncamp.org.

Attention all committees: The Board would like for you to communicate with us regarding projects and fundraisers you are planning. We would like to support your endeavors and projects and would like to make sure that multiple committees are not planning on tackling the same area to prevent overlapping, or we can connect those committees so they can work together.

Boats that are by the pole barn that are not claimed and removed by July 1, 2019 will be sold or scrapped.

The board would like to remind members that Michigan law prohibits anyone under the age of 21 to consume **alcohol** and to have any amount of **alcohol** in their body. The **law** prohibits the attempt to possess or consume **alcohol** by an **underage** person as well. It is not permitted for anyone under the age of 21 to sell, use, possess, and attempt to possess, deliver, or be under any degree of influence (legal intoxication not required) of any alcoholic beverages on DFCSCA grounds.

As a reminder, Smoking is not allowed within 25-feet of any building entrance.

As a member with a child or children between the ages of 19 and 25, it is your responsibility to ensure that they work 16 hours or pay guest rates at the beach and sauna. They also are required to pay guest rates if they stay at a camp. See blue book for rates.

At the sauna building do not park along side of the building adjacent to the outdoor men's changing area as this is a fire lane. In case of an incident an emergency vehicle will need to have access to this area.

Non-members whose stay in a camp exceeds three consecutive days and two consecutive nights in a 30-day period without a member present, or exceeds 10 days and 9 nights in a 30 day period with a member present must pay a rental fee of \$50 a week. Please see the Board Treasurer to sign a contract and provide payment.

Remember that animals must be on leash except in designated areas. See Blue Book rule 203.1.3

No open ground fires permitted.

No overfilling. No furniture, propane tanks, wood, construction materials or other large items are to be left in, by or around the dumpster. Large items can be placed at roadside near the tractor garage on Tuesdays for Wednesday pickup. Finn Camp or member construction materials can be placed in the dumpster by the pole barn.

Parking can be an issue in Camp Country. Please be courteous to other members and have guests park in designated areas. On the west side guests can park down by the restrooms and on the east side guests can park at the club room and walk over.
