Joensuu, Finland: FinnFest USA returns to Finland for its 2020 festival, August 16-21.

Did you miss the first FinnFest USA festival in Finland? the one in Tampere in 2018? That first effort asked the question: could being in Finland fulfill the FinnFest USA original and ongoing mandate "to provide Finnish Americans and their progeny an opportunity to meet one another and to broaden and deepen their knowledge of Finland and Finnish American history and culture?" Yes, it could. Bringing FinnFest USA to Finland worked. Attendees met and made new American friends. Finland and Finnish America made new connections. Understanding of Finland and Finnish America deepened.

Building on that success, FinnFest USA announces its 2020 festival, this time in Joensuu, a metropolitan region in the Eastern Finland. Using the Northern Karelia location to assist Americans gain new clarity about this culturally-significant region and new understanding of who Finland is today, speakers and site visits will, at the same time, unlock better understanding of Finnish America's own past and present.

Like the long-accepted paradigm of its Americansited festivals, this FinnFest USA festival will create an in-depth experience built out of the resources of the festival site. Beginning Sunday evening, August 16^h and continuing through Friday evening, the 21st, when FinnFest USA attendees will join Joenyö, an annual city-wide "community night out party", this six-day Finnish immersion experience will focus on both the historic and contemporary: the world from which Elias Lonnröt and late 19th century artists and composers, people like Järnefelt, Gallen-Kallela, Sibelius, created a Finnish national identity; the world in which contemporary Finns confront enormous environmental changes while reaffirming equitable health and education goals for all.

These topics, introduced in lectures and discussions, will precede tours within and beyond the central city. For example: on Tuesday, after lectures on landscape and climate, attendees will travel to Koli, Finland's quintessential landscape. On Wednesday, attendees will choose a topic (Finland's health care, crafts world or education systems) that combines lectures and discussions with intimate site visits within Joensuu.

An all-day tour to Ilomansti on Thursday will provide an intimate connection to Karelia without the hazzle of a visa to visit Russia. Winter and Continuation War battle sites will introduce the contemporary experiences that Finland continues with its eastern neighbor. Evenings will include concerts and films.

FinnFest USA is partnering with Borton Overseas Travel, a specialist in travel to the Nordic countries. Attention all committees: The Board would like for you to communicate with us regarding projects and fundraisers you are planning. We would like to support your endeavors and projects and would like to make sure that multiple committees are not planning on tackling the same area to prevent overlapping, or we can connect those committees so they can work together.

The board would like to remind members that Michigan law prohibits anyone under the age of 21 to consume **alcohol** and to have any amount of **alcohol** in their body. The **law** prohibits the attempt to possess or consume **alcohol** by an **underage** person as well. It is not permitted for anyone under the age of 21 to sell, use, possess, and attempt to possess, deliver, or be under any degree of influence (legal intoxication not required) of any alcoholic beverages on DFCSCA grounds.

Trash Rules: Dumpsters are for members use only! Do not put in large or long items that may wedge or jam the dumpster when being tipped into the garbage truck. No major dumping on festival weekends. No overfilling. No furniture, propane tanks, wood, construction materials or other large items are to be left in, by or around the dumpster.
