Sami Story



My Great-Grandmother Naimi Ericksson Rutanen died at 22, so I grew up knowing nothing about her. I only had a photo. It showed that she had dark hair and dark eyes.

She married a "traditional" Finn, blond with blue eyes and they had my grandmother Mailis- who had dark hair and dark eyes.

When I asked my great-great Aunt Rose about Naimi, she gave me her usual Finnish reply - "Why do you want to know that?"

My Aunt Rose treated family history like secrets carefully guarded by the Finnish CIA.

I did manage to get two answers from her that told me nothing - and yet quite a bit.

"She was from a different part," she said.

"She wasn't Finnish?"

"Yes, but she had dark hair and eyes, most Finns have blond hair," she said.

So, I started learning about Finland and discovered what was then called Lapland (now Sapmi) and the Lapps, or Laplanders. Today, they are called the Sami, or Saami. Lapps- is considered a derogatory term and is actually a Swedish word that means "ragged."

I saw photos of the Saami and I saw that they also had dark hair, and almond shaped eyes- which reminded me of that photo. I realized- although it has not been DNA tested, that she must have had some Saami ancestors.

Saami live in Northern Finland, Sweden, Norway and Northeastern parts of the Kola Peninsular in Russia. They are Europe's only indigenous people and were in Finland before the "Finns" were.

As glaciers melted and retreated north, the Saami entered the land - most likely from Siberia- and lived for thousands of years, before gradually moving North- away from new comers from Estonia and Lithuania-present-day Finna.

They're the reindeer herders living up in the Northern Lights in the land of "Santa Claus."

Naimi came from Pori, on the west coast- and far from Sapmi. Ericksson is a Swedish name, so they obviously originally came from elsewhere- was it the Swedish north?

Although, it was not so much where Naimi lived that made her "different," it was the difference in her appearance.

The Saami are a discriminated people and an abused culture, much like the American Indians of North America.

In both situations and culture clashes- the newcomers- forced out the original indigenous people and even indoctrinated them in schools in an attempt to erase their culture and language.

Today, Finns are more sensitive to how the Saami have been treated- and their role in it.

Saami also have gained strength in government and in their efforts to be recognized as their own people and culture. - *Constance York*
