— THE SAUNA IS OPEN BY APPOINTMENT ONLY! —



The sauna remains open Saturdays and Sundays from 12pm-9pm by appointment only (first come first serve) using Signup Genius with only 6 people allowed per side per 2-hour time period - no walkins.

Sauna is limited to one 2-hour slot per person per day. A new sign-up link will be emailed and posted on the Members Only Facebook page at the beginning of each week. Due to consistently open slots, 1 guest per 2-hour period per side from 2pm-9pm will be permitted (only 1 guest per membership, per day).

Members sponsoring a guest must be attending sauna during the same time period as their guest but may be using the opposite side. Please use the designated "GUEST" signup slot for your guest and indicate the sponsoring members name in the comments. It is the sponsoring members responsibility to make sure guests follow all sauna rules and state COVID-19 regulations. 12pm-2pm is reserved for those 65 years and older and those with health risks for MEMBERS ONLY.

Children of all ages count as 1 person so please include them on the sign-up if they are attending sauna.

If you are on the delinquent list you will not be permitted to sign-up for sauna until your delinquency status has been lifted. Do not attend sauna if you are ill. Each person will be asked COVID-19 screening questions upon entry. Please check in with the sauna manager before entering the building. A 24-hour notice to cancel your sauna appointment is required; otherwise you will be billed for the standard sauna fee. Please arrive promptly at your scheduled time, not earlier (please wait in your car if you are early). You must be out of the dressing room by the end of your scheduled time. Please be courteous to your fellow members. The sauna will be closed 4:00 to 5:00 p.m. for sanitation.

The lounge area remains closed. You may walk through to the dressing rooms but do not congregate in the lounge. Everyone is required to wear a mask upon entry / exit and inside the dressing rooms and in the bathrooms. It is recommended that masks be worn inside the sauna but not required.

PRIVATE SAUNA RENTALS

If you are interested in renting the sauna for private use outside normal operating hours, you can make arrangements through the social director, Joni Sennhenn, at 248-882-4626. The number of occupants for private rentals is limited until further notice to 6 people per side. It is \$25 per hour per side to rent (minimum of 2 hours) with a refundable \$50 cleaning deposit. You can rent one or both sides. The renter is responsible for cleaning the sauna, dressing room, bathroom and shower area after use in order for the cleaning deposit to be refunded. The member must be in good standing (zero balance on Finn Camp account) to rent the sauna. The contract and payment must be submitted to the social director prior to the date of rental.

With our Centennial celebration fast approaching in 2025, we recognize that we've evolved over time. When Harry Kansman and other leaders spearheaded the effort to get the Finn Camp listed as a Michigan State Historic Site in 2007 and subsequent listing as a National Register of Historic Places in 2007, our legacy was preserved for future generations. There would be no paved parking lots with strip malls, and no motorboats on Sun Lake. We've continued to embrace our Finnish heritage and culture while welcoming new innovations to improve and enhance our way of life. Our camps have gone from canvas and candlelights to shingle-roofed wooden structures with electricity. We have hot water showers in our bath houses. Our woodsmen have gone from using two-man ripsaws to powerful chainsaws and electric log splitters.

Even our board room has gone from pencil and paper to a modern office with computers, printers, and copiers. We will continue to evolve as we embrace new innovations.

One such innovation is in the medical world. As you know, the opioid crisis has spiraled out of control in major cities and small communities. We can't pretend that it can't happen in our small community. We hope that it never does. However, we must be prepared. One of our members, David Grogan, has taken a big step in our preparedness for such an He has generously donated a occurrence. NARCAN (naloxone HCL) inhaler to our First Aid Kit at Sun Lake. This is a life-saving device that we would hope we never have to use. However, if one of our members or guests were to fall victim to an opioid overdose, we should be prepared. It is an easily administered inhaler that doesn't need a medically trained person to use, however a subsequent call to 9-1-1 is absolutely necessary even if the victim is resuscitated. This is a very important donation from David. With relaxed laws surrounding the NARCAN prescription, hopefully we'll be able to add subsequent inhalers to our supplies, if needed. The newsletter staff will also look to make sure our First Aid Kit is stocked with the basics. It's better to have these supplies and not need them, than to need them and not have them. Thank you, David Grogan.

Submarine in Sun Lake

A long time ago, I heard a story about a submarine that was built and tested in Sun Lake. It was hard to believe if it was true or was it fiction. Just recently, Russ Matero gave me some photographs in the form of slides to scan and one had an object in the water from the top of the tower view. "Ah, there is that sub I read about." I told myself. I asked Russ about it and he found two more slides. There was little known about it, but what I found out is that Mark (Markku) Karell built it in 1969 with help from Dan Aro and Toivo Rentola. It was welded up mostly at Dan's house. Mark used the Case tractor to move it to Sun Lake for testing in the spring before the beach was open for the summer. The sub didn't have any leaks and lead weights were added for ballast to test how far the sub would sink down in the water. This was the only time the sub was put in the lake for a test. Mark decided that the sub was not practical and the project was discontinued.





Mark was a member as a child of members Jack and Aini Karell. During my research, I found out that Mark died at 73 on July 11, 2020. Here is a link to his obituary.


THE EASTSIDE COVERED BRIDGE

Bridges are the theme of popular songs, of favorite books; they even feature in movies. For centuries they have served an important role in civilization: from connecting neighborhoods, cities, countries and culture

to serving as meeting points for idle teens and romantic encounters. They serve double-duty as landmarks and æsthetic structures. At Finn Camp we are fortunate to have our own miniature version: a ruggedly-handsome covered bridge connecting the Eastside camps to the *kenttää!*

Walk over the bridge to the *kenttää* in the spring as the tender green buds begin to emerge on the branches; listen to the notes of the cheerful birdsong. Stroll over it in the dense verdant foliage of summer; watch a snake slither into the woods. Wade through the dense mass of leaves underfoot in the fall; spot an owl up on a high branch. Or trudge over the bridge when it's piled high with drifted snow and follow the tracks of a rabbit or squirrel. Irrespective of the season, it's always a special spot!

If you look up at the rafters you'll see a small photo of a middle-aged man, sitting casually on the handrail, a peeled sapling. The heading: REY'S 'ROSSING. A short explanation of the spelling: since these initial combinations of consonants don't occur in Finnish, some first-generation Finnish speakers of English had some difficulty pronouncing the initial consonant clusters containing an r [br-,cr-, pr-, tr-], so **Br**uce's **Cr**ossing became 'Ruce's 'Rossing [my grandparents lived in this small town in the UP]; **Tr**out **Cr**eek became 'Rout 'Reek. And so on. Eventually it became a kind of joke among second-generation Finns.



The Rey of "Rey's 'Rossing" is Reino Solin, whose sons Reino and Eric are both Finn Camp members. The bridge was both designed and built by Rey [fondly known at the campgrounds as "Rey Dad"] and stands close to the original family camp, now owned by Eric. In an effort to stem the rising water from Sun Lake, a trench had been dug between Sun Lake and Loon Lake. As water from Sun Lake filled the trench, the need for a bridge soon became apparent.

Simple planks originally provided a crossing, but persistent moisture eventually decayed the wood. Member Russ Mattero suspects that Rey chose to cover the present bridge--built in 1969--as protection from rain, snow and leaves. According to him, the roof's cedar shingles lasted about 40 years and were replaced by Reino and Erik. A little TLC is necessary for maintaining its beauty, and an occasional board or two has of necessity been replaced over the years.

Rey was a master of brick and mortar, as well. A bricklayer and mason, he also built the massive Clubhouse fireplace in the 1960s, the Voima Boys' flagpole stand, and the cement-block wall surrounding the sauna dressing rooms [early 1980s].

Large items can be placed at roadside near the tractor garage on Tuesdays for Wednesday pickup. The dumpster at Sun Lake is for Finn Camp projects only. No personal or camp debris is allowed.
