m What I admire most about Finland is their emphasis on gender equality. Finland has been awarded the second best country to be a girl. Not only was Finland the first country to grant women full political rights in 1907, but today it also ensures close to 50% of parliament is led by women. 49% of all employed people are women. 45% of ambassadors in the Finnish foreign Service and over 50% of Finland's 560 diplomats are women. Finland even has a female prime minister, Sara Marrin. Some of the best Covid responses world wide came from countries led by women, including Finland. So, why wouldn't we want more women making the tough decisions? Women can be diplomatic, smart, savvy, innovative, multitasking and pass legislation that favors both children and adults. Especially since some women are mothers, being a woman leader can mean children citizens grow up with better lives. Young girls can feel valued, can have strong female role models and can reach their full potential. We need more women leaders to find peaceful solutions rather than those toxic males who dominate certain countries with war and violence. Other nations should follow Finland's example, so we can build a more equal and vibrant society in our future.

The Horseshoe Court resides on the 'The Hill' and is flanked by the Clubroom/Dancehall, Kentta/Ravintola, and George Aho Field.





Boats & Personal watercraft registration will be required by all members.

Per Bluebook rule-203.3.5

- Non-members shall not be allowed to launch boats or ice fishing facilities from our lakeshore property. Members shall identify their boats with their membership number and register their boats with the Board of Directors.

In accordance with this rule there is now a form on the Finn Camp website so that members may register their boats/personal watercraft. They will then receive their membership# sticker for adherence to their boat/personal watercraft and the registration will stay on file with the BOD. Any boat/personal watercraft that is not registered by June 1st, 2022 will then be held to Blue Book rule-105.3.1- Property other than real estate may be sold provided a notice is given in the newsletter by the Board of Directors for 3 consecutive months. If the acceptable bid is not received from a member, then the property may be disposed of at the discretion of the Board.

No overfilling. No furniture, propane tanks, wood, construction materials or other large items are to be left in, by or around the dumpster. Large items can be placed at roadside near the tractor garage on Tuesdays for Wednesday pickup. The dumpster at Sun Lake is for Finn Camp projects only. No personal or camp debris is allowed.

Facility Reservations: Any member interested in renting the clubroom, dancehall, ravintola, or beach should contact the social director, Joni Sennhenn, at 248-882-4626. Also, all committees should verify venue availability with the social director prior to scheduling events as private rentals may conflict.

Camp rentals are handled through the Board of Directors. Any member looking to rent their camp should complete a camp rental form and submit it to the Board prior to the rental date.
