Juli Wood Quartet
this September

### Meet this Finnish folk jazz quartet:

Juli Wood, a saxophonist and singer over the past forty years, has recorded two CDs of Finnish jazz folk music, Synkka Metsa / Dark Forest & Suomen Salossa. All of Juli's grandparents immigrated from Pohjonmaa, Finland in the early 1900's, giving her deep Finnish roots. She currently resides in Chicago where she plays jazz in clubs and festivals.

Paul Silbergleit, a jazz guitarist as well as a composer and jazz instructor for the Milwaukee Jazz Institute, has played professionally over the past thirty years. His mother immigrated from Norway, making him a second generation Scandinavian. To date, he has multiple CD's out.

Clay Schaub, a prominent jazz bassist, is a composer and faculty at the Milwaukee Jazz Institute. He's also recorded some of his own music.


Mike Schlick, a jazz and blues musician, has recorded with many local jazz musicians and played professionally for the last thirty-five years around Chicago and Milwaukee. As an honorary Finn, Mike has been dubbed Mikko Schlickko since he and Juli have traveled to play jazz in Finland multiple times.

Eight years ago, The Juli Wood quartet formed and has been together ever since. They recorded their first CD of Finnish folk songs, Suomen Salossa, in 2018, then held a concert in Bemidji, Minnesota at the Finnish language camp in Salolampi. Thanks to a generous grant by the Finlandia Foundation, this September will be the quartet's first Finn Camp performance and second visit since their 2018 Performer of the Yeartour.

"We had such a great time at Finn Camp and hoped we could come back someday with the full quartet and play," said two of the quartet's members, Juli and Mike.

### Hi Finn Camp Members,

Here's some news from the "invasive plants" committee. We're making great progress. You may notice that someone is mowing down lots of Japanese Bittersweet along both sides of sauna road. (Members Michael Honka and Scott Tipala.) Now we have the ability to walk in without tripping. We are asking for members to help take down the scrub trees and vines that grow up in the healthy trees.

Also, we have a project in process at the beach. Our motivation is to clear the area along the fence and merry-go-round. Once this area is clear, mowing will keep the bittersweet down and we'll have additional space and shade area. Take a look at the massive and majestic pine that has been cleared of the choking bittersweet! Very pretty.

The mechanism in the merry-go-round is still in very good shape after all these years. We simply need to replace the boards that are weather-worn and paint them. We are looking for a carpenter to help with this project.

One idea we have been kicking around for several years is to have families or groups of friends "adopt" a specific area and keep it clear year after year until all invasives are cleared out. In doing this, we will encourage the native species to reseed. Future projects may involve the planting of native species. More details on this idea are to be announced at semi-annual meeting.

We want to make this a fun adventure involving some contests to be figured out. And of course, you will be getting work hours.

In accordance to bluebook policy, we have posted boat registration for over three months and therefore the board will be taking action to dispose of any unclaimed watercraft.

Per Bluebook rule-203.3.5 - Non-members shall not be allowed to launch boats or ice fishing facilities from our lakeshore property. Members shall identify their boats with their membership number and register their boats with the Board of Directors.

Blue Book rule-105.3.1- Property other than real estate may be sold provided a notice is given in the newsletter by the Board of Directors for 3 consecutive months. If the acceptable bid is not received from a member, then the property may be disposed of at the discretion of the Board.
