

Darlene Joyce (Riekki) Lahde formerly of Walled Lake passed away peacefully on Nov. 21, 2023 at the Woodland Hospice House in Mt. Pleasant with her children and family by her side.

She was 85-years old.

Darlene was born on July 19, 1938 in Negaunee and raised in nearby Palmer, the first child of Elmer and Iria (Hokkanen) Riekki. She graduated from Negaunee High School in 1956 and moved to Milwaukee for a year with her girlfriends before returning home and marrying James A. Lahde Sr. on April 4, 1959 at St. Paul's Catholic Church in Negaunee.

The couple relocated to Oakland County in the summer of 1962 and raised their three children in Wixom.

Darlene worked many jobs during her lifetime. She was a secretary for the City of Wixom in the mid-1960s before taking a job as a librarian at Walled Lake Western High School upon its opening in 1969. She also spent 27 years as a baker at Awrey Bakery in Livonia before retiring in the mid-2000s.

Darlene's passions in life were three-fold. She loved her family first and foremost.

She also loved the Detroit Finnish Co-Operative Summer Camp Association (Finn Camp) and she loved to shop for bargains and treasures.

Darlene was a proud member of the Finn Camp for decades and it was her social circle for decades. In particular she loved the sauna and the beach. She was one of the 'sauna girls' for over 50-plus years as it was her favorite home away from home. All three of her children are sauna-enthusiasts as well.


When she wasn't working or at the Finn Camp Darlene was probably out shopping. She loved garage sales, yard sales, estate sales and pretty much any kind of sale that someone was selling. This trait too she passed on to her children. Her oldest-daughter Lori followed mom's lead as she opened a soon-to-be legendary second-hand vintage store in Kalamazoo called 'La-De-Da's' in the 1980s and ran it through the early-2000s.


Over the past four years of her life Darlene battled numerous ailments, yet she managed to keep her independence up through the summer of 2023.


