Finns Can’t Predict Political Trends Either

Last fall, Tuomas Koskeniemi (29) and his brother Johannes (27), in Washington, D.C., began building a website, VotingAid.com, to help U.S. voters pick the politician they wanted. They thought, perhaps naïvely, that just because half the voting population of Finland uses electoral websites to match up voters with politicians whose views most closely meet their own, they could use the same techniques to pin down the Republican presidential contenders’ positions on matters such as climate change and tax policy. They had hoped to rank each candidate from 0 to 100 on their agreement with 21 specific policy statements. For example, after reviewing Newt Gingrich’s positions from the mid-1990s on, they finally decided in December to go with his most recent statement that he didn’t know if global

In a split decision recently, Robert Helenius, a Finn, won the European heavyweight boxing championship. Helenius, nicknamed the Nordic Nightmare, won the decision over Dereck Chisora of Britain. This was the first-ever European heavyweight championship for a Finn. For the 28-year-old Helenius, this was his seventeenth win without a loss as a professional.
